In poultry, K. I. Jennings, superintendent, promises a display of birds and rabbits hitherto unequalled in the annual event.

In the floral department, special garden entries are being arranged for the eight-day run. Other types of floral entries will be outstandingly colorful and profuse as indicated by Mrs. Claude Miller, manager of this division.

A flood of entries in the Textiles Division has Mrs. A. J. Ullman, superintendent, and her staff busy with recording and arranging for proper display of all the expected articles of handicraft.

In Foods, Mrs. Gladys Turnbull, manager, has arranged a number of outstanding demonstrations by representatives of the country's leading appliance and food manufacturers.

In addition, entries in the various classifications show that the department will be crowded, showing the bounty of Oregon and the skill of Oregonian housewives.

An interest center for the agricultural-minded will be the \$500,000 display of the latest in farm machinery, equipment and appliances will overflow the machinery area.

shadow of doubt. Standard procedure for experienced woodsmen is to stir and scatter the coals while soaking them with water, and then to wet the ground around the fire.

Make sure the match is out by breaking it in two before throwing it away.

Smokers should observe the law that forbids throwing of cigarette stubs or pipe ashes from car windows. Smokers in the forests should be sure stubs or pipe ashes are dead out, and placed in non-flammable spots.

Remember, says Ross, the time to stop a fire is before it gets started.

Bulletin Tells How To Make Juice at Home

Simple directions for making tasty and nutritious fruit and vegetable juices at home are outlined for Oregonians in a new bulletin from Oregon State college.

Entitled "Home Processing of Fruit and Vegetable Juices," the handy new experiment station publication was written by Dr. H. Y. Yang and E. H. Wiegand of the food technology department.

An abundance of fruits and vegetables in Oregon makes home juice making especially worthwhile, the authors point out. The family budget benefits as well as the family diet too because the juices are inexpensive to make and utilize fruits

and vegetables that are not suited for canning or freezing because of size or defects.

The publication gives directions for making apple, grape, berry, pear, plum, cherry and blended fruit juices along with tomato, rhubarb, sauerkraut, carrot, beet, turnip and blended vegetable juices.
