Rugs Find Favor With Homemaker, Says Specialist

Today's homemaker is turning to rugs over smooth floor surfaces instead of wall-to-wall carpeting, according to Myrtle Carter, Oregon State college home furnishings specialist.

She said the new trend is for the rugs to accent living areas, defining conversational groupings of furniture.

The change in living habits has brought about the new style, Mrs. Carter explained. Entertainment is less formal today. Conversational groupings, informal dining arrangements and television are all responsible for the popularity of the area carpet, she said.

The furnishings specialist reminded that newly-exposed traffic lanes of highly-polished or waxed flooring are additionally important. Increased attention is focused on such materials as wood, tile, marble, vinyl and rubber for decorative bases.

She said heavy, rough textures for

rugs are now preferred by most home decorators.

Even lower income groups are able to live more attractively than ever before because of cotton and man-made fiber floor coverings, such as nylon and rayon. Cotton carpeting—which looks up-to-the-minute—comes in a wide range of colors and now is accepted as a fine item on its own, regardless of cost, Mrs. Carter said.

"Floors are no longer taken for granted," she commented. Even the kitchen and bathroom tell floor-covering style stories of their own.

GARDEN NOTES

The preparation of the soil for transplanting trees and shrubs is a very important step. We all know that when we prepare a seed bed it should be worked up thoroughly and organic matter and fertilizer incorporated with the soil so that the little seeds will grow rapidly. This same preparation is greatly desirable in setting a new plant. In this case the soil must be thoroughly prepared for a foot or more below the surface. A large hole should be dug so that there is ample room for the roots and for the ball of dirt around the roots. There should be enough additional room so that good fertile top soil could be carefully wrked in around the roots.

Do not put any manure or commercial fertilizer in the immediate vicinity of the roots. A little well rotted manure in the bottom of the hole with about 4 inches of dirt on top would be alright but it is safest to apply such materials as a surface mulch. Two or three shovels full of peat moss should be thrown into the hole and chopped into the hole with a shovel before planting. Some peat moss should also be mixed with the soil used to fill in around the roots. The peat moss serves to keep the soil moist and well aerated which gives the new rootlets an excellent chance to develop and absorb moisture and nutrients. Extra care in planting will be well repaid by more vigorous growth the first year.
