EDITORIALS

BUILD FAITH IN OUR CHILDREN

In accepting the National Chairmanship for the 10th annual observance of National Sunday School Week, which will be celebrated April 12 through 18 this year, Irving S. Olds, prominent New York attorney, had this to say: "I think we will agree that Sunday School Week is a week of great significance for the nation. No one can minimize the importance of Sunday Schools in fostering among the youth of the country a faith in God and an ability to recognize what is fundamentally right and just."

National Sunday School Week and National Bible Week are staged annually by a hard-hitting organization, the Laymen's National

Committee. The slogan for Sunday School Week this year is: "To Build Faith in Our Children—Take Them To Sunday School."

"Perhaps now more than ever before our nation," in the words of the Committee, "is beginning to respond to those simple beliefs of our forefathers, those same tenets and principals that made this great country of ours what it is..."

April in U.S. History...

1492, April 17—Agreement signed between Columbus and Spanish Monarchs for voyage to find new route to East Indies by sailing west.

1775, April 19—Battle of Lexington began the Revolutionary War.

1775, April 6—Ports ordered open to all Nations except Great Britain. Importation of slaves forbidden.

1782, April 19—Holland recognized the Independence of the United States.

1789, April 6—Congress organized. Electoral vote counted. George Washington declared President.

1806, April 2—Lewis & Clark discovered Willamette river.

1818, April 4—The flag of the U.S. established as 13 horizontal stripes representing the original States in alternate red and white, and a white star in blue field for each State of the Union.

1830, April 10—Wagon train left St. Louis for Oregon.

1846, April 25—War with Mexico begun.

1850, April 3—First "Pony Express" left St. Joseph, Mo. and arrived Sacramento, Cal. April 13 bringing eight letters.

1861, April 12—Civil War begun with attack on Fort Sumter.

1865, April 9—General Lee sent flag of truce to General Grant. April 15—Death of President Lincoln, 7:22 A.M.

1867, April 12—Treaty for purchase Alaska ratified by the Senate.

1892, April 19—First gasoline automobile operated by its inventor C. A. Duryea.

1898, April 21—War with Spain begun.

April 24—Dewey ordered to Philippines.

April 27—President Dole of Hawaii offered to transfer Islands to U.S.

1900, April 15—Strike of laborers on Croton Dam, N.Y. for advance from \$1.25 to \$1.50 a day.

1903, April 28—N.Y. Court of Appeals declared eight hour day unconstitutional.

1904, April 22—Contract for transfer of Panama Canal property to U.S. signed in Paris.

1906, April 18—Earthquake followed by fire destroyed much of San Francisco.

1915, April 29—Germany warns against Atlantic. (Liner sunk by German Sub May 7.)

1917, April 6—Proclamation of the President declared U.S. at war with Germany.

1920, April 9—Joint resolution to end war with Germany passed.

1924, April 23—Soldiers Bonus Bill passed by the Senate.

1945, April 12—President Franklin D. Roosevelt died.

1947, April 7—Henry Ford died, age 83.

1949, April 6—President Truman declared he would approve use of atom bomb again.

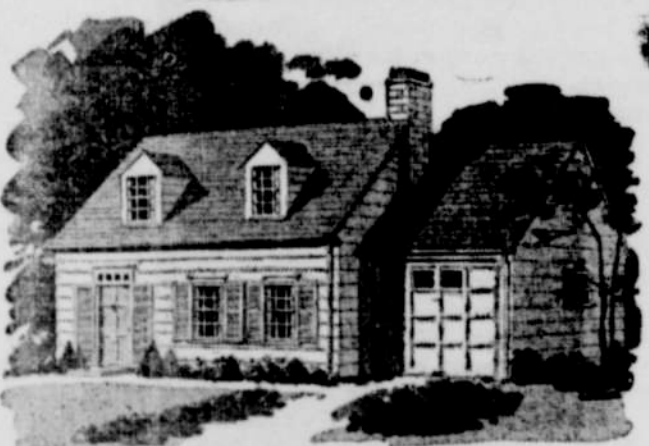
