

Three Grass Fires Call Volunteers During Past Week

Volunteers of the Central Point Rural fire department answered three grass fire alarms during the past week.

The first alarm sounded late Thursday afternoon, June 3, calling the department to the Medford Gun club to extinguish a grass fire. Three to four acres of grass were burned. The blaze reportedly started from burning rubbish in a high wind. Several traps on the club grounds were scorched slightly by the fire.

The second alarm of the week sounded Sunday afternoon. Volunteers made a run to the IOOF cemetery to put out another grass fire. No graves were harmed by the fire. The cause is unknown.

The last alarm of the week sounded at 12:30 p.m. Monday, June 7. The grass fire on Upton road burned over about five acres.

Burning trash in a strong wind was given as the cause of the fire. Volunteer firemen stopped the blaze before it reached heavy brush.

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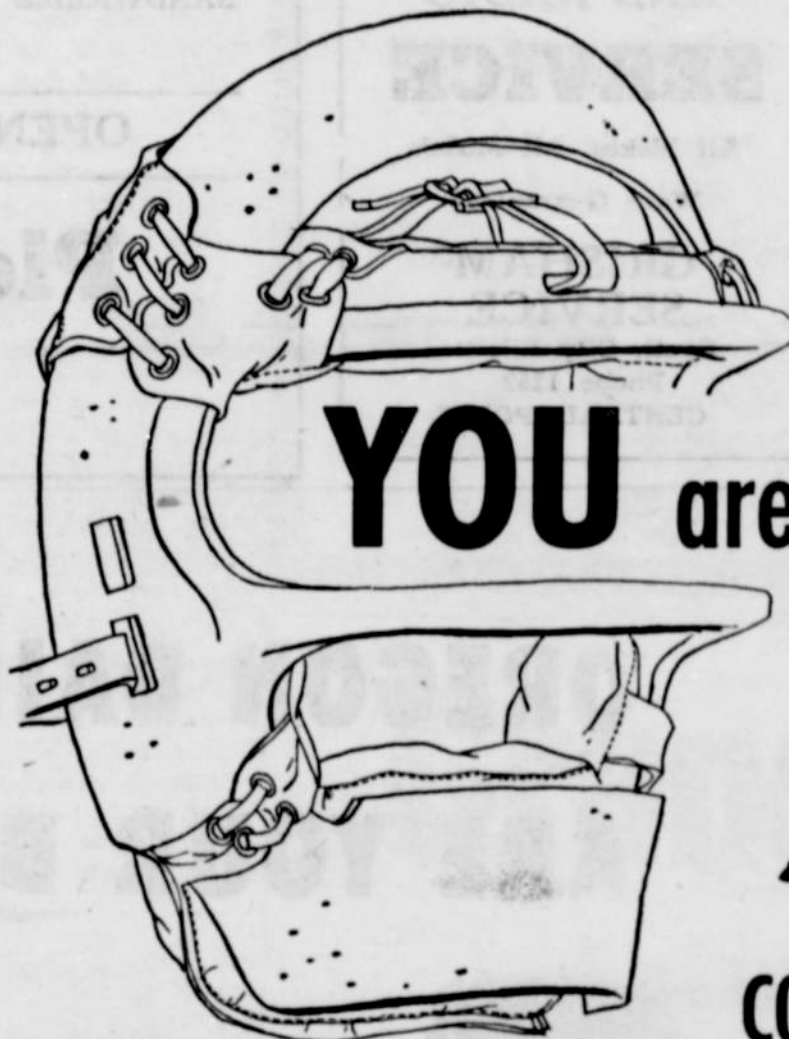
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
