**RESOLUTION NO. 119**

A RESOLUTION submitting to the legal voters of the City of Central Point at the regular municipal election to be held November 2, 1954 at and with the state and county general election a proposed act of municipal legislation amending the Charter of the City of Central Point by adding thereto a new Article to be known as Article XXXIV authorizing the common council to create further bonded indebtedness of not to exceed \$20,000.00, for the purpose of constructing, furnishing and equipping a building for fire hall and library purposes in said City.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CENTRAL POINT, OREGON:

Section 1. That there be, and hereby is, submitted and proposed to the legal voters of the City of Central Point for their approval or rejection at the regular municipal election of the City of Central Point to be held at and with the state and county general election on the 2nd day of November, 1954 the following proposed act of municipal legislation amending the Charter of said City:

**AN ACT**

To amend the Charter of the City of Central Point, Oregon, being an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Central Point, Jackson County, Oregon," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 25, 1889, and to amend all other and subsequent amendments thereto enacted by the legislative assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF CENTRAL POINT that the Charter of the City of Central Point, being an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Central Point, Jackson County, State of Oregon," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 25, 1889, as amended by all other and subsequent amendments thereto enacted by the legislative assembly or by vote of the people be, and the same hereby is, amended by adding thereto a new Article to be known as Article XXXIV to read as follows:

**ARTICLE XXXIV**

Section 1. The City of Central Point is hereby authorized and empowered to build, construct, equip and furnish within the corporate limits of the City of Central Point a building for fire hall and library purposes for the use and benefit of the inhabitants of said City and to acquire all property, real and personal, appurtenant thereto or connected therewith and for the purpose of providing funds therefor the

Council of said City is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell general obligation bonds of said City in the sum of not to exceed \$20,000.00, notwithstanding any debt limitation or restriction now contained or provided in or by the Charter of said City or any amendment thereof. The debt limitations or restrictions contained in or provided by the Charter of said City or any amendment thereof limiting or restricting the total indebtedness said City may incur or any provision of said Charter or amendment thereof regulating the issuance or sale of bonds shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized or the indebtedness created by the issuance of such bonds.

Section 2. The common council is hereby authorized to levy taxes in addition to all other taxes upon the taxable property of the City of Central Point in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the bonds hereby authorized.

Section 2. That the same places are hereby designated as the polling places within said City for the regular municipal election as those polling places selected and designated as the precinct polling places for the said state and county general election.

Section 3. That the same persons are hereby designated as election officials for each precinct as those selected, or to be selected, for said state and county general election.

Section 4. The Recorder of the City of Central Point is hereby directed to give notice of the proposed Charter Amendment hereinbefore set forth by publication of this Resolution once in a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of Central Point and by posting a copy of this Resolution in three (3) public places within the City of Central Point and also at each of the polling places for such election, said notice to be given by publication and posting aforesaid not less than ten (10) days prior to such election, and no further or other notice of the aforesaid proposed Charter Amendment to be voted on at

said election shall be required. Section 5. The ballot title for such measure provided and returned to the City Recorder by the City Attorney is adopted as is hereinafter set forth and the following are the numbers, ballot title and form in which the aforesaid measure will appear upon the ballot:

Charter Amendment Submitted to the Voters by the Common Council.

CHARTER AMENDMENT PROVIDING FOR FIRE HALL AND LIBRARY BUILDING: An act amending the Central Point Charter so as to authorize the Council to construct, furnish and equip a building for fire hall and library purposes, to issue and sell general obligation bonds in an amount of not to exceed \$20,000.00, exempting said bonds from debt limitation, and providing for a tax levy to pay such bonds.

Section 6. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this Resolution is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety and owing to the urgent necessity of providing the inhabitants of said City with the building hereinbefore mentioned, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Resolution shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval by the Mayor.
