## HOME FROM ONTARIO

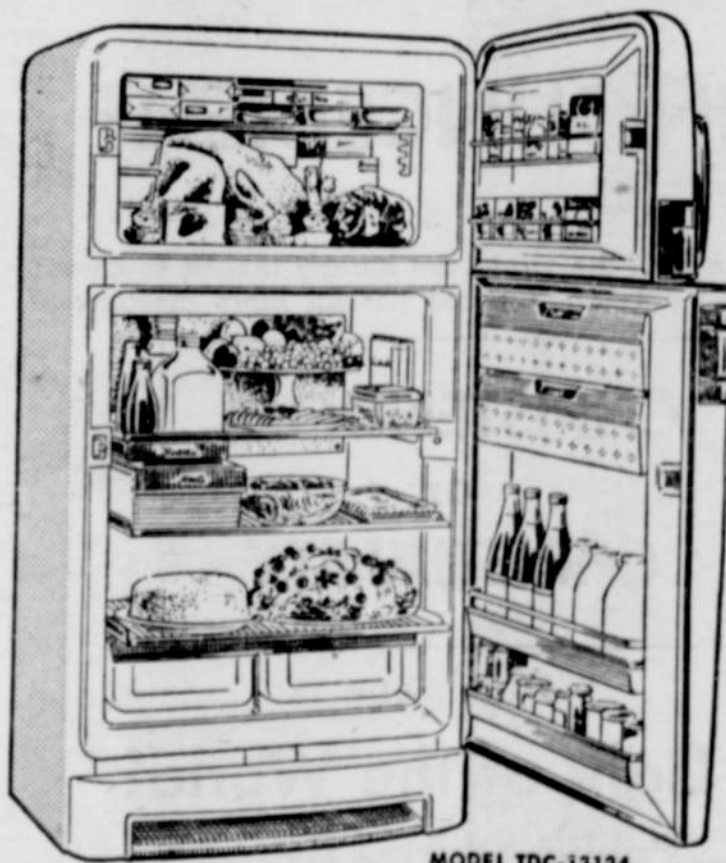
