Sealed bids for the construction of a Fire Hall and Library Building will be received at the City Hall, Central Point, Oregon until 8 P.M., Pacific Standard Time, April 25, 1955, and will then and there be opened and publicly read aloud. Bids received after the hour set for opening will not be considered.

Bids will be received on the basis of one contract to include all work with alternates deleting wiring and plumbing. In addition to the above, individual bids will be called on the wiring and plumbing. Awards will be made on the basis of the lowest combined bid.

Bids must be submitted in the exact form of the Proposal and Bid Form incorporated in the specifications.

Plans and specifications will be on file after March 31, 1955 at the office of R. J. A set of drawings and specifications may be obtained by prime bidders from the Architect upon a deposit of \$50.00. Such additional sets shall remain the property of the Architect and shall be returned to him in good condition after the opening of the bids.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the school district bond election hereby called, to be held at the following polling places, to wit: at the elementary school gymnasium building in the City of Gold Hill, Oregon, and at the Junior High School gymnasium building in the City of Central Point, Oregon, in and for School District No. 6 of Jackson County, Oregon, on Thursday, the 28th day of April, A.D. 1955, between the hours of 2 P.M. and 8 P.M., Standard Oregon Time, there will be submitted to the legal voters of said district the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds with which to construct, to equip and furnish elementary school buildings, one building to be located on lot 12, Block 2, Riverside Addition on 2nd Avenue in the City of Gold Hill, Oregon, and one to be located at 10th Street and Manzanita Street in the City of Central Point, Oregon.

The vote on said question shall be by ballot, upon which shall be the words "Bonds Yes" and "Bonds No"; and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the word "Bonds" and the word "Yes", or between the word "Bonds" and the word "No", whichever indicates his choice.

Notice is hereby further given that the district school board of said school district, for the purposes of aforesaid bond election, has divided said school district into two election precincts, one of which consists of all that part of said school district lying and being within election precincts numbered 76 (Rogue River), 78 (Gold Hill north), 79 (Gold Hill south), and 80 (Foots Creek) as established by order of the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, as election precincts for general elections and all legal school voters of said school district residing within said general election precincts shall vote at said election in the elementary school gymnasium in the City of Gold Hill, Oregon; the other of said election precincts of said school district consists of all that part of said school district lying and being within the election precincts numbered 22 (Eagle Point south), 24 (Trail), 25 (Shady Cove), 69 (Central Point west), 70 (Central Point northeast), 71 (Central Point southeast), 71-A (Central Point southwest), 72 (Willow Springs), 73-A (Mound), 74 (Sams Valley), and 75 (Wimer), as established by order of the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, as election precincts for general elections and all legal school voters of said school district residing within said general election precincts shall vote at said election at the Junior High School gymnasium building in the City of Central Point, Oregon.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contraction of said indebtedness, will, on said day and date and at the places aforesaid, be opened at the hour of 2 P.M., Standard Oregon Time, and will remain open until the hour of 8 P.M., Standard Oregon Time, of the same day at which hour the polls shall be closed.
