NOTICE OF SPECIAL
ELECTION OF THE
ROGUE RIVER VALLEY
IRRIGATION DISTRICT
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:
1. That a special election will be held in the Rogue River Val-

ley Irrigation District, Jackson County, Oregon, on Friday, the 15th day of July, 1955, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock in the morning and 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon at the office of the District, which special election shall be for the purpose of determining whether the Board of Directors of the District shall be authorized for and on behalf of the District to enter into a repayment contract with the United States of America, for the following general purposes: To provide for the repairing and rehabilitation and betterment by the United States of the District's irrigation facilities including, but not exclusive of, that portion of the District's irrigation facilities jointly owned with the Medford Irrigation District; to obligate the District to repay to the United States the cost of such construction, rehabilitation and betterment of said District's irrigation facilities in an amount not to exceed \$236,534.00 repayable without interest as follows: In 40 equal annual installments, the first of which installments shall be due and payable on December 31st in the year following the year in which the Secretary of Interior notifies the District that the work required to rehabilitate and better the District's irrigation facilities jointly owned with the Medford Irrigation District has been completed, and a like equal annual installment on each December 31st thereafter until the total amount has been paid; to make the contract obligation a general obligation of the District; to provide for assumption of control of the District's irrigation facilities by the United States, if the District defaults, and for the inspection, care and protection of the District's irrigation facilities, and to contract with respect to those matters which are pursuant to the provisions of the Federal Reclamation Laws and of Acts amendatory or supplementary thereto.

2. That the maximum amount of money proposed to be payable to the United States by the District for construction purposes, as aforesaid, is the sum of \$236,534.00.

3. That for the purpose of said special election, the polling place has been established and located by the Board of Directors as follows: The regular office of the District located on the West side of the original Pacific Highway between the city of Central Point and the city of Medford in Section 12, Township 37 South, Range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian in Jackson County, Oregon, being the regularly used and established polling place of this District and situate within the district.

4. That the special election shall be by ballot; that the proposition to be voted on at the special election shall be as follows:

PROPOSITION: Shall the Board of Directors of the Rogue River Valley Irrigation District, Jackson County, Oregon, be authorized to negotiate and enter into a repayment contract with the United States of America, in conformity with the the proposal specified in the notice of this election, under the provisions of the Federal Reclamation Laws and of the laws of the State of Oregon authorizing the District to enter into such contracts.

The ballots to be used at such election shall put the foregoing proposition to the qualified electors by the following words and symbols:

Contract with the United States—Yes—(—)
Contract with the United States—No—(—)

5. That all persons qualified to vote at Irrigation District elections under the laws of the State of Oregon shall be entitled to vote at said special election and the election shall be held and the results thereof shall be determined in all respects in conformity with the provisions of the laws of the State of Oregon.

6. That the polls shall be open at 8:00 o'clock in the morning on the 15th day of July, 1955, the day of said election, and shall be kept open until 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon of said day, when the same shall be closed.

Absentee Ballots Okayed for Voters In Water District

Under the authority of the ruling of the Attorney General of Oregon and pursuant to a resolution of the Board of Directors of the Rogue River Valley Irrigation District, absentee voting has been authorized in connection with the special election to be held by the Rogue River Valley Irrigation District on July 15, 1955, to determine whether the Board of Directors of the District shall be authorized to enter into a repayment contract with the United States of America.

Applications for absentee ballot must be in writing and signed by the applicant and received in the office of the district at Rt. 2, Box 365, Merriman Road, Medford, Oregon not later than 5 o'clock p.m. Pacific Standard Time, July 6, 1955. The absentee ballot must be received by the office of the district not later than 5 o'clock p.m., Pacific Standard Time, July 11, 1955. The application forms must be obtain-

ed from the office of the district.

Any person who is a qualified elector of the district and who is absent from the county upon said election date, or whose place of residence is more than fifteen miles from the polling place in the precinct of his registration, measured by the nearest traveled road, or who is physically unable to attend such election in person is eligible to make application for an absentee ballot.
