## Water Users OK Repayment Plan

Water users in Rogue River Valley Irrigation District gave their approval to a repayment contract with the federal government for rehabilitation of canal systems in the special election held Friday afternoon, July 15, at the district office on Merriman road.

The total vote was 96 yes and 4 no.

With the favorable vote, the board of directors is now authorized to enter into a 40-year, interest-free repayment contract with the bureau of reclamation, which will have charge of the proposed work.

Medford Irrigation District water users approved a similar repayment pact by a vote of 163 yes and 6 no.
