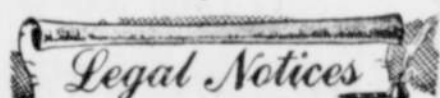

Gold Hill Road Officially Named

GOLD HILL—A name has been officially placed on the signposts designating the road that has been called north frontage road or river road. Now it is Lampman road, through the efforts of Dave Ennis and others on that thickly populated area a name that means something is now official.

This road on the south side of the river from Gold Hill, is the one going to Ben Hur Lampman park from the underpass on highway 99 just east of Rocky Point bridge, the park being directly across from Gold Hill, can also be reached from the overpass to the south of Gold Hill which is the east end of the Lampman road.

Ben Hur Lampman Park is a state park, named for Ben Hur Lampman, poet and essayist of Oregon and editor and publisher of the Gold Hill News between the years 1912-1916. At present the park is rather sorry looking. A well furnishes drinking water, nice benches and picnic tables are there, but little shade and because of so many berry bushes weed killer was used making it unattractive and other trees are not grown or plentiful enough for shade.

Trails to the river and fishing spots as well as view points make up for some of the lacks.

The state highway had recently completed a roadside rest park at the cloverleaf from Gold Hill to highway 99 south. This is attractive with shade, tables and water but no access to the river or scenic views.
