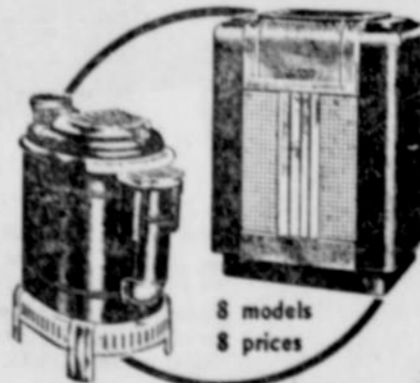
BROTHER VISITS

Tax millage during the current fiscal year has dropped for Central Point Rural Fire Protection District and total assessed valuation in the district has increased, members of the board of direct-

ors were told at the regular meeting Tuesday evening at the local fire hall.

Total assessed valuation for the fire district during the 1955-56 fiscal year is \$7,559,414.84. The tax millage amounts to 4.3.

The 1954-55 fiscal year valuation totaled \$6,030,970.20. The millage rate last year was 4.7.

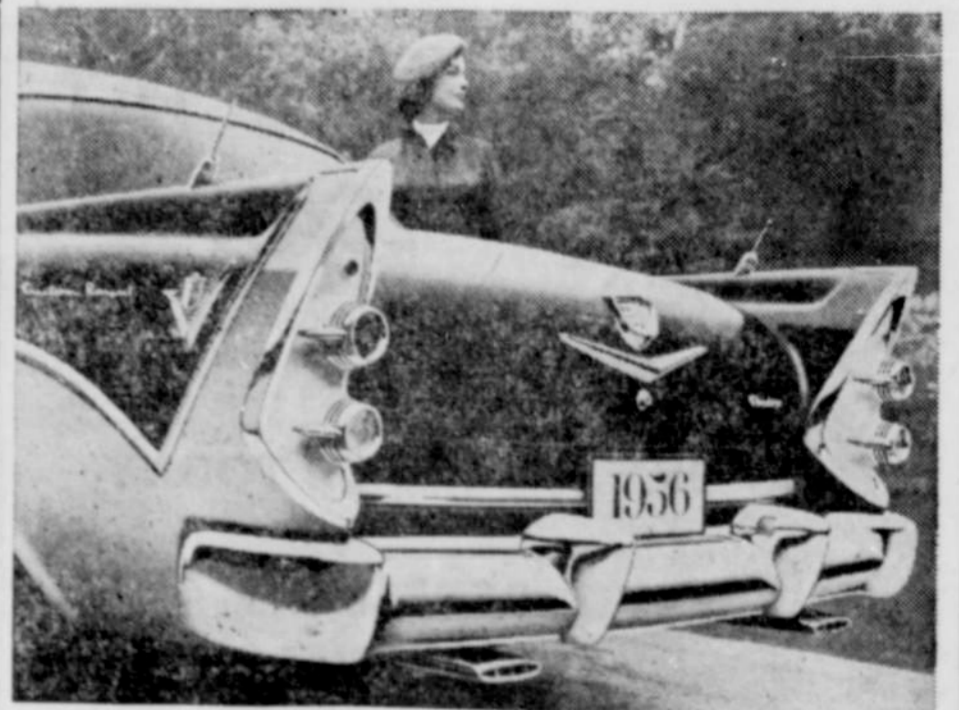
