One of the ten week courses will be a continuation of a course started last year, Animal Disease, Control and Sanitation. Dr. E. M. Hanawalt of Central Point will again teach the class.

Kunzman stated that notes of last year's course are available to previous class members by contacting him. A \$5 fee will be charged.

The second 10 weeks course will have to do with the general care and repair of farm tractors and trucks. This class will be limited to 15. A \$10 fee will be charged.

bott and Bill Anhorn from the school board.
