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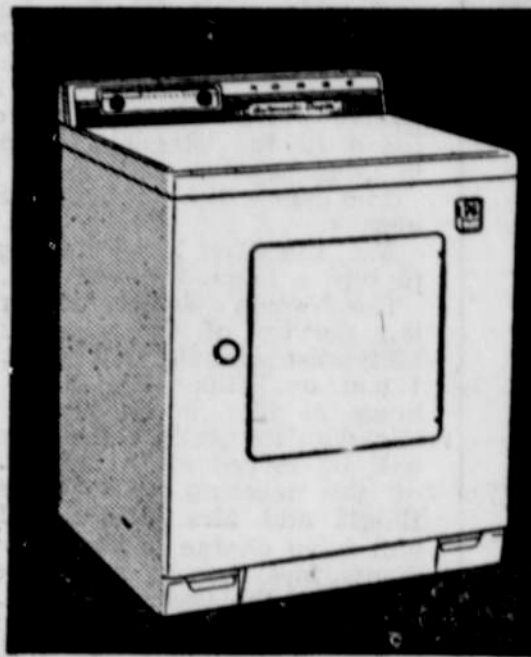
Construction of a water main between Amy and Haskell streets in the southwest portion of the city was started Wednesday. A six inch main will be installed

and a fire hydrant will be put in place at the corner of Haskell and Ash.

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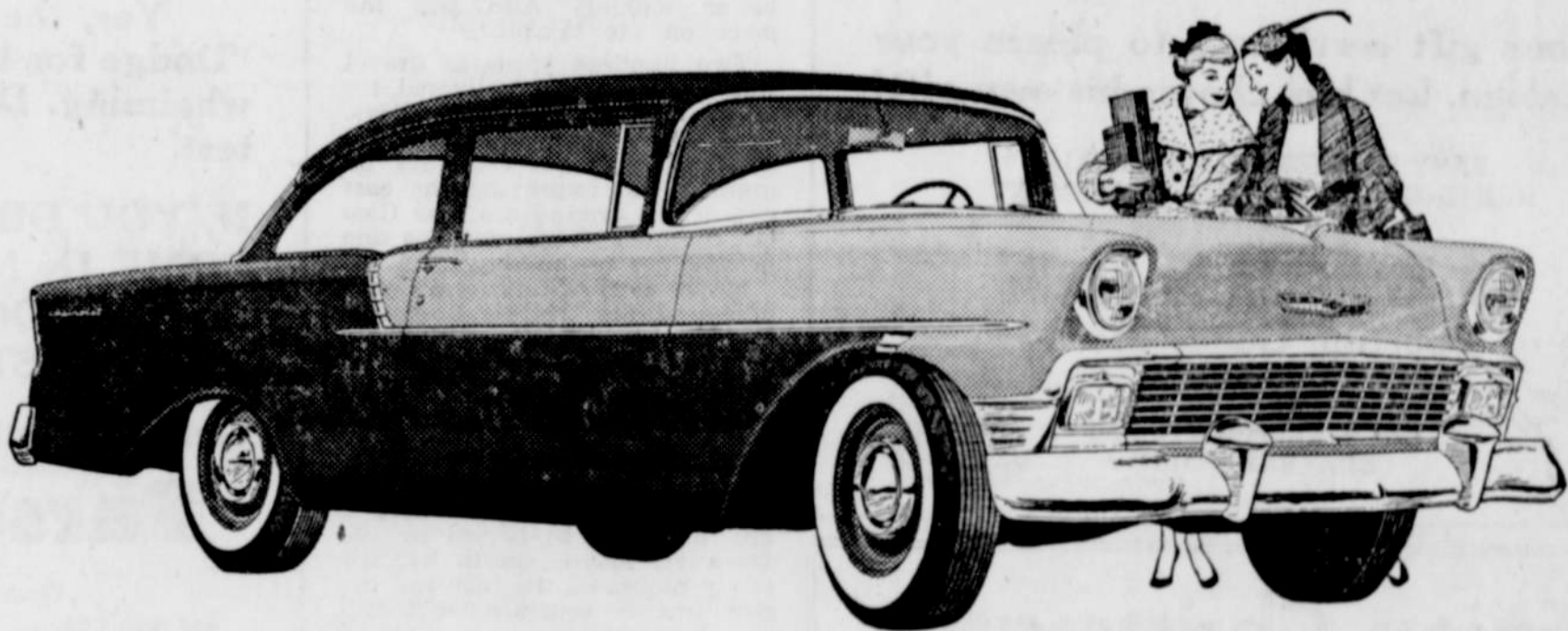
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
