## Dog Ordinance Rules Outlined

City residents were made aware of the city ordinance pertaining to the dog problem last week when copies of Ordinance 321 were included with monthly water statements.

The city ordinance defines dogs as nuisances if they: (a) howl or bark in such a manner as to deprive any person of peace and quiet, or (b) roam about the city, or (c) trespass on property other than that of the owner or custodian of the dog, or (d) bite anyone or show a propensity to bite persons.

The ordinance also provides that it is unlawful and a violation of this ordinance for anyone to allow his dog to be a nuisance in any of the ways mentioned.

It is also possible for a large fine to be imposed upon violators of this ordinance.

Any injured person or anyone having knowledge of a violation may charge the violator and have him arrested by filing a complaint at the city hall.

## Over 4000 Persons Receive SS Benefits

At the close of 1955, 4,145 persons in Jackson county were receiving a total of \$207,233 in monthly benefits under the old-age and survivors insurance provisions of the Social Security program.

Beneficiaries by groups and the amount of payments are listed below:

Retired workers, 2,537, \$148,492; wives of retired workers; 706, \$21,545; children under 18: 544, \$20,699; widows: 268, \$12,225, and mothers of children under 18: 86 \$4,064.
