Totals \$845,517.23**

Bonded indebtedness of School District 6, serving the Central Point-Gold Hill areas, totals \$845,517.23, according to a June 30 statement of condition issued from the office of the Jackson County Treasurer.

Bonds issued by the school district, as reported by the treasurer, are dated from July 1, 1947, to June 1, 1955.

The total of bonds outstanding amounts to \$885,000 less a sinking fund of \$39,482.77 leaving a balance of \$845,517.23.

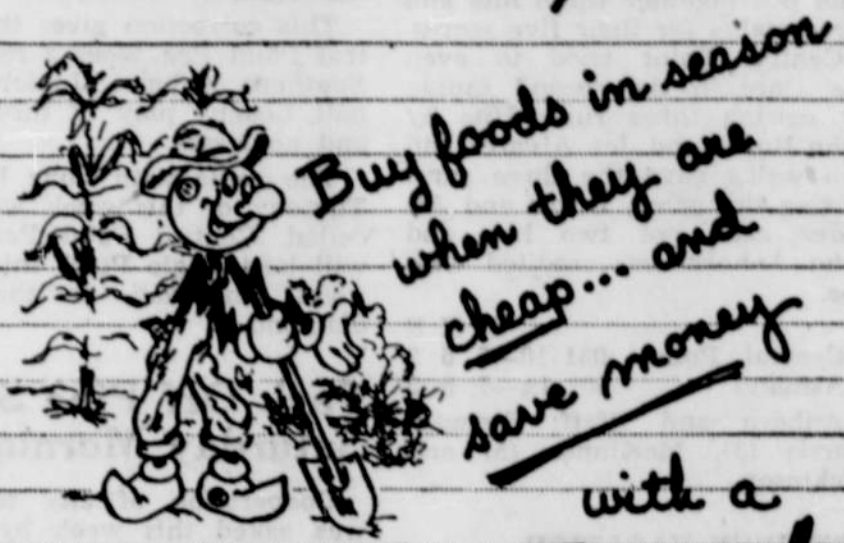
Mr. and Mrs. Bill Barber and two children returned home Friday from a ten day vacation trip spent in Los Angeles, Los Vegas and Disneyland.
