

# 14 Grid Lettermen to Head Crater High Team for 1956

Fourteen lettermen are expected to head a squad of 50 boys when practice sessions open on Monday, August 27, for the 1956 Crater High school football season. Coach Leonard Warren said yesterday.

Lettermen who are expected out Monday in the first session are: Ends—Carl Koellner, 2 year, and Jerry Kime, 1 year; Tackles—Dave Parker, 2 year, and Dick Davis, 2 year; Guards—Don Hubbard, 2 year, and Roger Seaman, 1 year; Center—Neil Green, 1 year.

Quarterback — Wayne Allen and Bob Elden, both 1 year lettermen; Halfbacks — George Juveland, 2 year, Lee Gossett, 1 year, Ron Harrison, 1 year, and Dave Wright, 1 year; Fullback—Don Goyette 2 year.

About 50 boys are expected to report for varsity practice with from 25 to 30 expected out for freshman ball.

Practice will begin at 7 p.m. Monday, August 27. After that first day, sessions will be held twice a day until September 7. A single workout is planned then for the season opener with Eagle Point on September 8.

Evening practices will be at 7 p.m. Morning drills will probably be held at 9 a.m.

Coaches for the Crater Comets this year will be: Varsity—Clarence Mellbye and Leonard Warren; Junior Varsity—Ed Knapp and Ron Lamb; Freshmen—Bill Piche and Jim Nau. JV and Frosh coaches will also assist with the varsity, according to Warren.

Squad members began drawing equipment yesterday. All equipment will be issued by Friday.

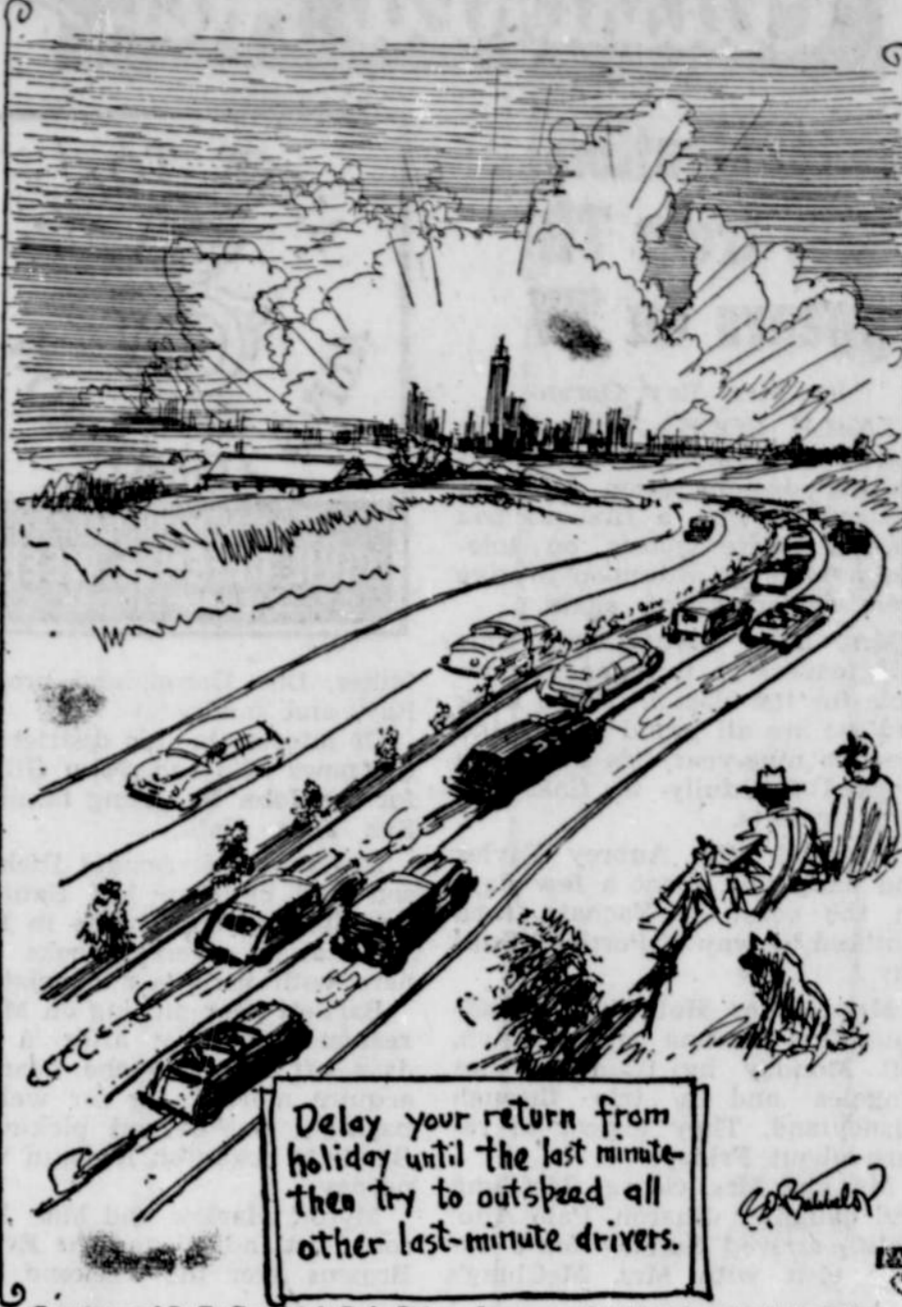
