Fay Bristol, head of Bristol Silica in Rogue River and president of the Oregon Mining Association, has issued a report on results of the last three months activities in mining.

He and others in the mining industry have held a series of conferences with government officials and out of these conferences have come:

- 1. An agreement that the USA needs high grade domestic chrome.
- be taken immediately to earmark enough money to take care of production above the 200,000 ton limit.
- 3. Contracts would be given for more than 2,000 tons production per year per operator. 4. Contracts will be negotiated on the West Coast.
- 5. Delivery may be accepted at other points than Grants Pass if real need is shown.


