REG. HEREFORD RANCH OPERATING



BRISTOL REPORTS ON MINING ACTIVITIES

Fay Bristol, head of Bristol Silica in Rogue River and president of the Oregon Mining Association, has issued a report on results of the last three months activities in mining.

He and others in the mining industry have held a series of conferences with government officials and out of these conferences have come:

1. An agreement that the USA needs high grade domestic chrome.
 2. That steps would be taken immediately to earmark enough money to take care of production above the 200,000 ton limit.
 3. Contracts would be given for more than 2,000 tons production per year per operator.
 4. Contracts will be negotiated on the West Coast.
 5. Delivery may be accepted at other points than Grants Pass if real need is shown.
- One of the most interesting parts of the report to non-miners is the agreement on the part of the government to provide for access roads into mining property.
