The next meeting of the Evans Valley PTA will be held on Feb. 5.



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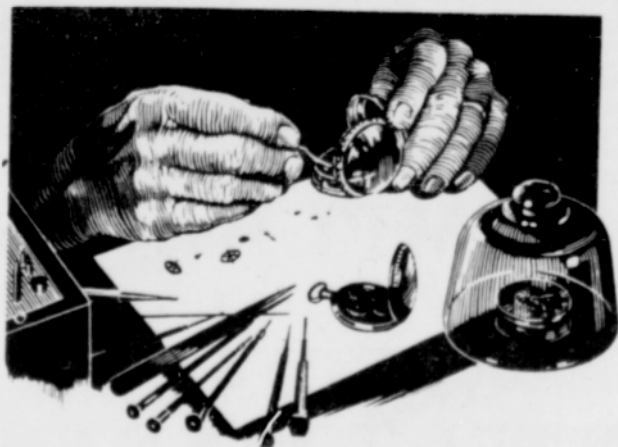
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
