

HANDS GO BACK TO EARLY SHIFT AS LIMIT OFF

Workers at the Magnolia Mill in Rogue River were back on the early shift this week as California Oregon Power Company announced the end of the power shortage.

The limitation was placed in effect Dec. 18 and the mill went on 11:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. hours.

The shortage was caused by unprecedented increase in power demand, greater than the previous year by 48,000.

Increased stream flow at Copco's existing plants and an additional block of power from outside the system has permitted the firm to increase its power supplies to the mill.

Mill hours are now 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., with lunch hour being from 11:30 to 12:30.
