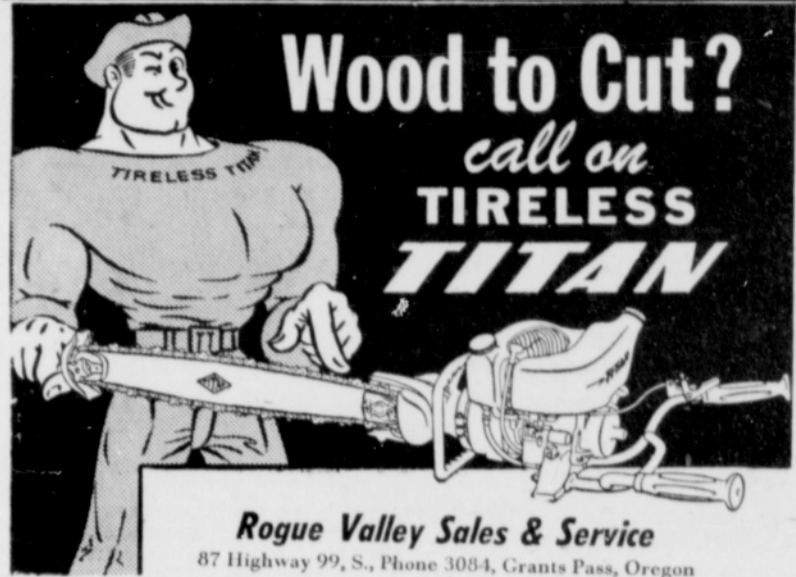
Mrs. Youngberg has sold her shop in Grants Pass and will rent the "Opal" shop.
