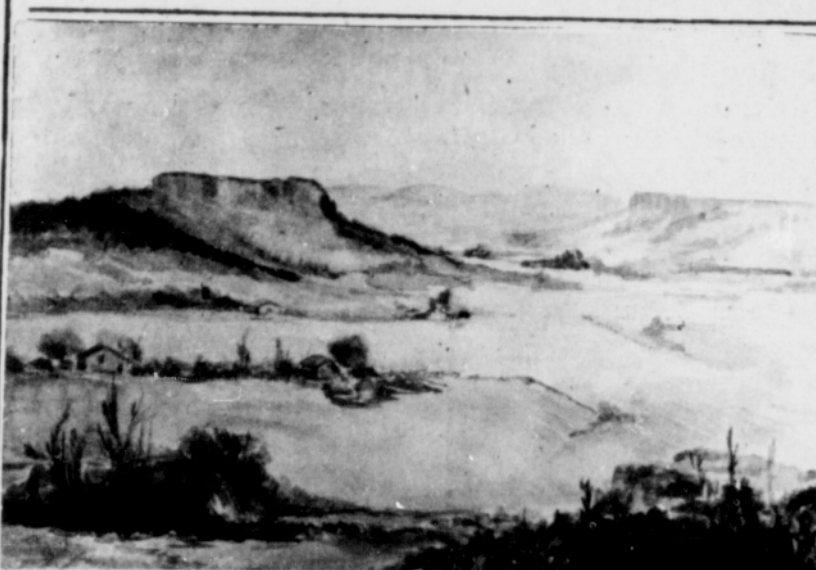
R.G. Scott of Rogue River spent Tuesday night at the Josephine County General Hospital, getting a blood transfusion.
