**NOW IS THE TIME TO SPRAY**

Boysenberries should be sprayed now for the control of leaf and cane spot, according to C.B. Cordy, county extension agent on horticulture.

"Use," he says, "10 gallons of liquid lime sulfur to 100 gallons of water, in the case of small sprayers; use 1 quart of liquid lime sulfur or 1 pound of dry lime sulfur to 3 gallons of water."

Another job that can be done now is pruning grape vines.

Pruning grapes frequently causes them to bleed but in the last few days cuts have remained dry, so now would be a good time to prune.

Most of our varieties, according to Cordy, do best if pruned to the long cane system rather than the spur system.

If the vines are up on wires, 5 or 6 canes 3 to 4 feet long should be left.

Walnut pruning is best left until April or early May.
