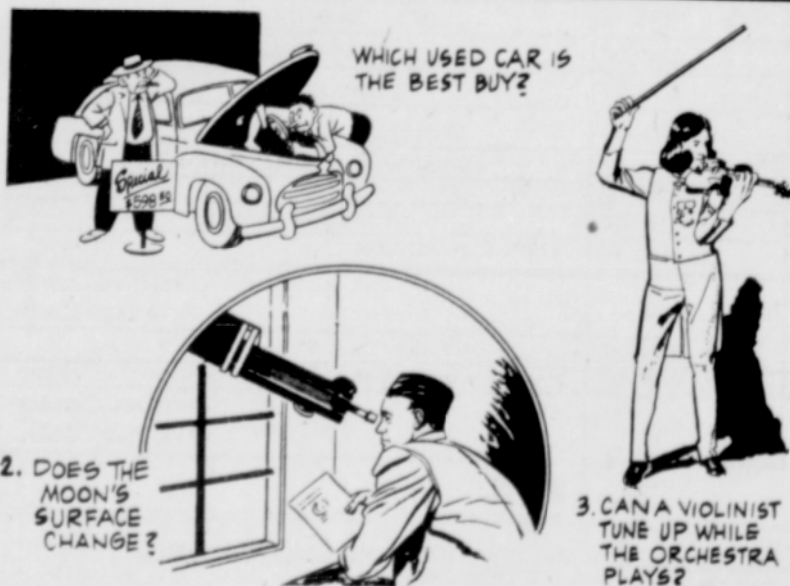

3. CAN A VIOLINIST TUNE UP WHILE THE ORCHESTRA PLAYS?

(1) "A two-year-old car is the best buy, if you can afford it," advises "Changing Times." The Kiplinger publication also urges you to buy from a new-car dealer who operates a used-car lot. His prices are probably a shade higher; but as a group, the independent dealers include a much higher fraction of the fly-by-night operators. Before you buy, find out the ceiling price from the local Office of Price Stabilization.

(2) Yes, Dr. James C. Bartlett, Jr., a Baltimore department-store executive, recently discovered a change on the surface of the moon. Huge walls on the moon's surface, photographed during the last century, have disappeared, he found. "The Baltimore Sun" reports that the British-Astronomical association named the area Bartlett in his honor.

(3) Most violinists can't, but the famed Nicolo Paganini had such sensitive hearing that he could check the tuning of his instrument by a slight touch of the strings, even during the noisiest orchestral passages. Franz Farga describes Paganini's talents in a book, "Violins and Violinists." Paganini could understand every word of a whispered conversation going on a considerable distance away. He often played perfectly pure notes on a violin which was completely out of tune.
