FIFTH ANNUAL FIELD DAY SET

The Southern Oregon Crops Experimental farm, located one mile west of Talent, will hold its fifth annual Field Day on the 19th.

Following a short talk by F. E. Price, dean, School of Agriculture, OSC, and Director of the Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station, there will be a guided tour of the farm.

Experiment station and extension service personnel under direction of Harold H. White, Agronomist in charge of Crops Research at the Southern Oregon Station, will be on hand to assist visitors in seeing and obtaining information about the crops growing on the farm.

Specialists from the Oregon State College at Corvallis and the county agents of Jackson, Josephine and Douglas counties will be present to discuss various crops growing on the farm.

Growing on the farm are 46 varieties of alfalfa, in excess of 100 species and varieties of grasses, 8 varieties of lotus and more than 100 varieties of wheat, oats and barley; 22 varieties of field corn and ten of forage sorghums. Many crops new to the area are being tested for adaptation to southern Oregon.

Results of varietal testing, fertilization, weed and insect control will be presented.

This is not only a farmer's field day, says Mr. White, but an opportunity for business and professional people to learn about some of the problems in growing the food, feed and fiber we all need in our everyday life, also to learn how the experiment station is organized and conducted to solve these problems.

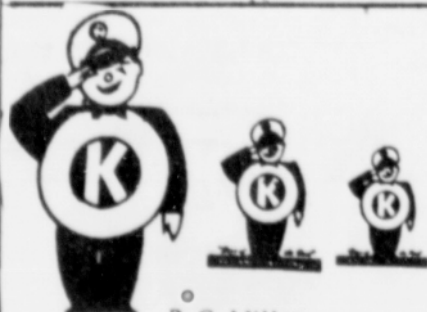

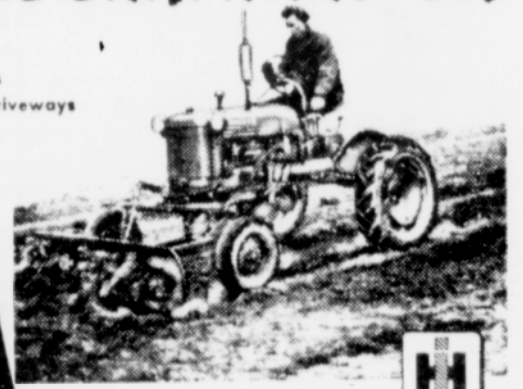
