RETURNS TO SOC

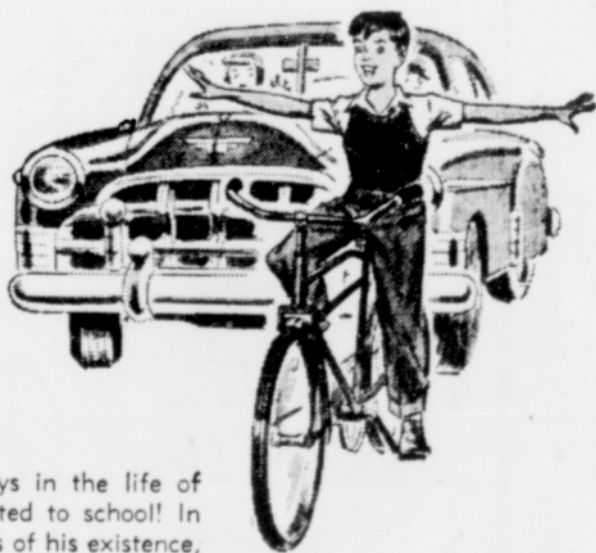
Beth Eskew, who has been employed in Lester's Market during the summer vacation has returned to Southern Oregon College of Education in Ashland.
