The wholehearted co-operation and generosity of the entire Rogue River and Wimer areas combined to make the local March of Dimes a real success.

Each and everyone of the populace can be justly proud of contributing both in effort and in money to the grand total of \$872 taken in to date. Officially the drive is ended but it is possible for a few outstanding delayed contributions to bring this total over the \$900 mark.

To mention each and everyone who worked for this goal would consume the better part of this edition of The Times which has already been more than generous in their publicity of this Drive. Since every organization, club, church and individual deserves more credit than space allows, here is a brief rundown on the drive from start to finish... the Lady Lions addressed and mailed contribution cards which grossed \$113.85... Live Oak Grange collected \$11.50... the Boy Scouts good deed resulted in the sum of \$23.58... the VFW Dance netted \$51.75 with Chuck Wheat's Orchestra contributing a share of their fee to the event... Wimer Grade School gathered a welcome \$11.80 with their school cards... the Evans Valley Health Club came through with \$2.70... even the Cub Scouts Den 4 proudly added \$.77... the iron lung coin collectors accounted for \$73.15 with the Bridge Cafe, The Hub, and Mary Ellens leading in Rogue River and Starr's Lunch ahead in Wimer... the basketball game gate amounted to \$109.75... thanks to a swell school faculty and a whale of a lot of good sports we have for neighbors... the concession added another \$18 and the blanket toss with the beautiful quilt donated by the Church of God's Ladies' Sewing Group helped the cause along with \$30.63, one Lion's Club pin and a lady's wedding ring... Rogue River Grade school kids dug deep for \$69.18 and

the High School students came in close with \$65.95. We were also given credit for \$16 worth of tickets sold by Mrs. Ray Holmes on the Medford steer.

The Lions Club added an extra \$4.31 to the already magnificent job of selling a total of \$400.75 worth of dinner tickets. Mrs. Patte Hopkins sold \$7.50 worth and the VFW sold the balance of the pies at their dance for \$6.60 bringing a gross of \$414.85 for the Turkey Dinner which was so capably prepared by Mrs. Carl Christensen together with plenty of competent and willing help from both Wimer and Rogue River... ladies of the Civic Club, Hobby Club, Garden Club, Lady Lions and the Teenagers... all of whom did their utmost to make this dinner the success it was.

This brought us to the grand total of \$1022.25 gross so with only \$150.25 worth of expenses we are able to send to the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis the amount of \$872 with our sincere wishes for early victory in their valiant battle against POLIO.

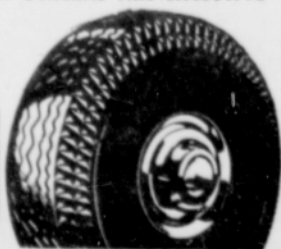
