

SWINE GROWERS PLAN APRIL CARCASS SHOW

Oregon swine growers will hold their annual hog carcass show in Albany early in April according to John Landers, Oregon State college livestock specialist. Tentative plans call for hogs to be shown on foot either April 7 or 8 and carcasses April 11.

Consumers' growing preference for lean pork will be felt at this year's show which is designed to help producers judge when proper finish has been reached for choice 1 grades, says Landers. Hogs weighing 190 to 220 pounds will be shown. Each exhibitor may show a single animal and a pen of 3 hogs from each breed that he produces.

The final placing for cash awards will be determined by judging the hog on foot and the cut-out value received from the carcass. Carcass value will be measured on a one-year average price as rated by the National Provisioner, meat publication.

Landers points out that consumers want the meaty-type hogs with just enough fat to produce good flavor. This is not a bacon hog but a well-balanced, heavily muscled animal that is well developed in the ham and loin. Other qualities which will rate high at the show are firm flesh, trim underline, and enough finish to produce high quality pork of high yield.

Robert Frederick Stromberg of Route 1 Box 44, Rogue River has enlisted in the Air Force, according to a report from Medford.

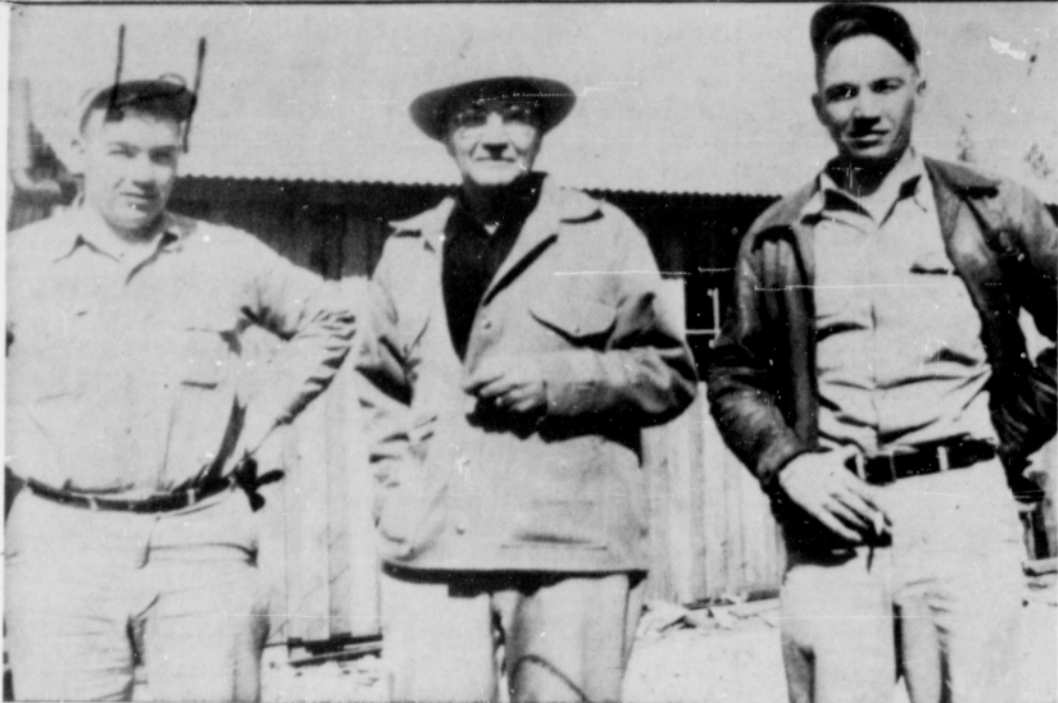

AROUND TOWN AGAIN

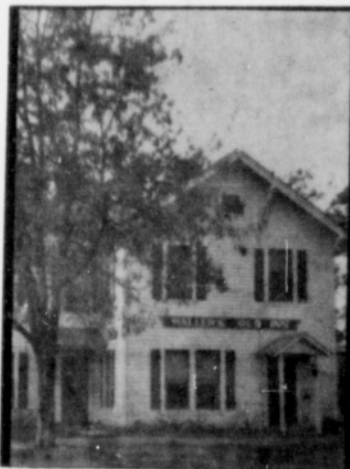
It is a pleasure to see George Irwin of Rogue River once again around town. He has been in the hospital and rest home for the past several months, and is once again looking himself.

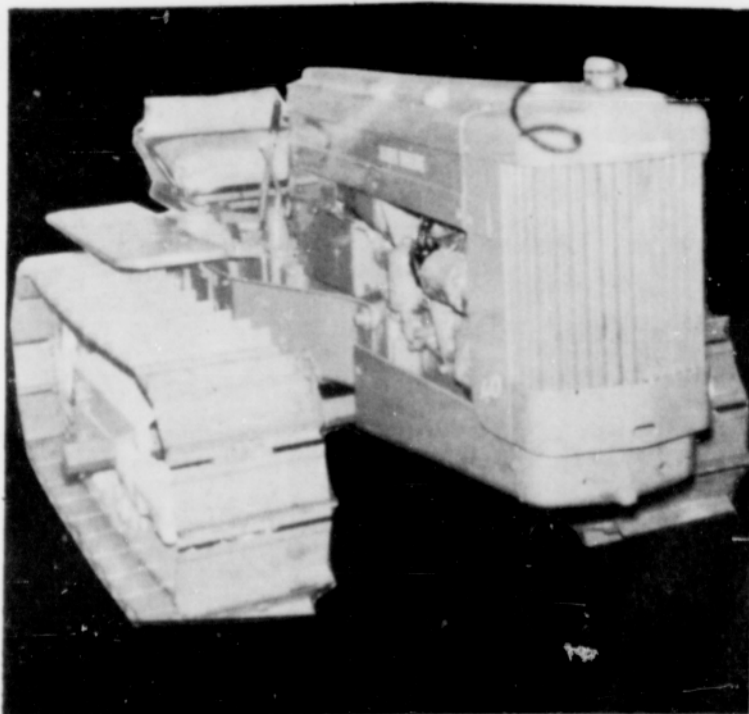
