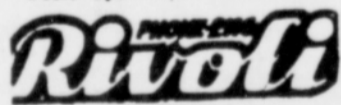

ESSAYS:

1st Prize - \$3 - Judy Farrar, Freshman. Title, "Forest Enemies" by "Doug" Fir as told to Judy Farrar. Very clever A story of the enemies of the Fir tree and the help man has given.

2nd Prize - \$2 - Kara Lee Irwin, sophomore. Title: "Guardians of Our Forests", a story of the Forest Ranger, his work and qualifications in helping preserve the forests.

3rd Prize - \$1 - Nancy Dessel, sophomore. Title: "Our Friend the Beaver". A complete story of the Beaver, how he works and is a friend to mankind.

The posters were judged by Mrs. Sam Bellah, Secretary of the Rogue River Garden Club; Mr. Walsh, Superintendent of Rogue River Schools; and Mr. Obey of the Forest Service, Grants Pass.

Posters were chosen from 45 entries and essays were the best three from 55 entries. The first prize poster and essays are to be sent to the State Federation of Garden Clubs to be entered for the grand prize of \$25 each. This award will be made at the State Convention, June 1st at McMinnville, Oregon.

The posters were displayed at the Isaac Walton Club in Grants Pass, then returned to the school Monday for any student who wishes to keep his or her poster.

Awards were presented to the winners at the matinee of the Senior High School play.

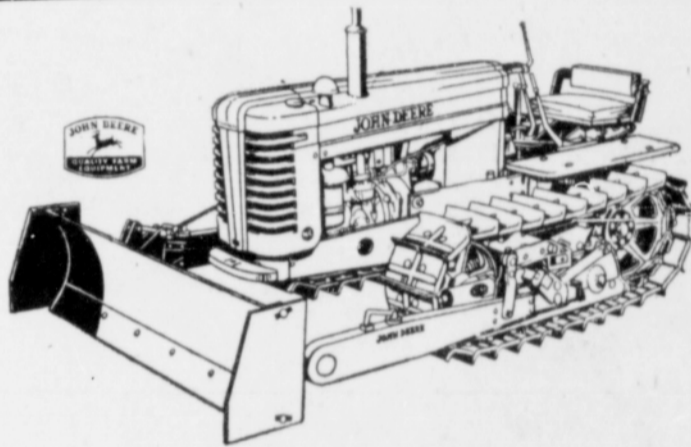
