The Joint Senatorship of Coos and Curry.

In a few months the preliminary steps toward the selection of candidates for the different offices to be filled by election next June, will be taken, and there are some questions of importance that should be settled before the calling of the primaries, if possible, or at least should be so fully discussed and understood that no doubt or uncertainty will exist as to what action should be taken. To this class belong the question which of the counties, Coos or Curry, should nominate the joint Senator for this district.

The counties of Coos and Curry have been associated together in a joint Senatorial and Representative district ever since the organization of Curry county, and during that time the two counties have generally alternated with each other in the nomination of the joint Representative. But the joint Senator when one was chosen from either of these counties, has always been a resident of Coos county; and Curry county has never had a direct Representative in the State Senate.

History of a Solid South. The Democratic party point with triumph to the South, where, by means of intimidation and violence they have suppressed the opposite political element, and it is by the solid vote of that region, supported by some Northern States that they hope to carry the next Presidential election. It has always been an easy matter to solidify the Southern vote in favor of their own interests. They have something to hope for by securing control of the country, and with an eye single to this benefit they resort to such measures as seem adapted to carry this point, making the end justify the means. The South has been solid before, and Gen. Woodford in his New York speech thus briefly tells what it means:

"It was a Solid South that tore down that ordinance that gave the great West and Northwest forever to liberty, and made the Missouri Compromise that it might get Missouri for slavery. It was the Solid South which, when a generation of years had swept in turn, tore down the Missouri Compromise that it might give all the Western land to slavery. It was that Solid South which, when beaten in a Presidential contest, rushed into war in the spring of 1861. Do you ask the meaning of the Solid South? I read that meaning in the ridges of every battle field from Gettysburg to the Gulf. Do you ask the meaning of the Solid South? I read that meaning in every soldier's crutch that rattles on your pavement. Do you ask the meaning of a Solid South? I read that meaning in every empty sleeve pinned up against a soldier's breast. I read that meaning in the annual coming of the tax-gatherer. I read that meaning in the million lives sacrificed in the awful maelstrom of the war. I read that meaning in the South devastated, in that land that is blasted, in homes that are desolate, in all the horrors of war; and because that is the Solid South of history, I plead with the patriots North and South that the South shall never again be permitted to be solid in our politics if by that solidity it is to rule and to desolate."

Death of General Hooker.

One by one the heroes of the Rebellion are passing away. Late dispatches announce the death of Gen. Joseph E. Hooker at Garden City, L. I., Oct. 31st. He was born at Hadley, Mass., Nov. 13, 1814. At the age of 19 he was sent to West Point, where he graduated in 1837. Florida was the scene of his first active service, where he took part in the Seminole war. Serving in the war with Mexico, he was brevetted for gallantry in several actions, and in 1851 was sent to California, but resigned in 1853 and engaged in farming in that State. On the breaking out of the war in 1861, he was appointed a Brigadier General, and in March, 1862, was assigned to the command of a division in the third corps of the army of the Potomac. Promoted to the rank of Major General of volunteers and continuing in command of a division, was engaged in the battles of Manassas and Chantilly, and was severely wounded at the battle of Antietam. Was present at Fredericksburg and participated in many other important battles, and was considered a good general.
