**Blaine and His wife.**

It was in Kentucky, says a correspondent of the Cleveland Leader, that Senator Blaine first met the lady who is now his wife. She was a Yankee and a school mistress, and she taught near the school presided over by Blaine. Blaine soon became acquainted with her, sparked her and finally fell in love with her. He went with her for some time, and was very anxious to know something about her family. She refused to tell him, evaded his questions, and gave him no satisfaction. He finally became engaged to her, and followed her to Maine, where they were finally married. When he reached Maine he found that she was the daughter of the editor of the Augusta —, I have forgotten the name, but it was the most prominent paper in the State at the time. He also discovered that her father was quite wealthy, and that the family was one of the oldest and most respectable in the State, one of the girls being of the Gail Hamilton literary fame. The marriage was that which brought Blaine to Maine to live, and it added much in making him a noted character that he is to-day. He remembers everyone and everything. They used to call him at college the Omniscient Blaine. He was also called Nosey Blaine; first for the reason of his immense natural proboscis, and second, because he knew so much.

**Schwatka's Discoveries.**

The Herald's London special says: Schwatka's discoveries and Polar matters generally continue to be the leading topics of discussion in the English journals. Among the latest contributions of the literature on the subject is a letter from Commander Cheyne in reply to an article to the Standard. "It was not the Arctic regions," says Commander Cheyne, "that sent Franklin's men to the next world. They were murdered by the contractor who supplied the expedition with preserved meats. The same contractor furnished Sir James Ross' expedition, to which I belonged, and the tins labelled 'Beef' and 'Mutton' were but offal. Some of the tins when opened contained nothing but big knuckles of bone. Everything belonging to the animals was put into the tins, except the horns hoofs and hides. The very entrails were there, and when they ate them, having nothing else, they had to hold their noses, so offensive was the stench. If Sir James Ross and his party had have been out another winter they would have starved. I have repeatedly in my lectures throughout England, denounced this contractor as a murderer, and dared him bring an action for libel. I should be glad to have him do so, for I could establish the truth of what I say."

**Mayor Kalloch Furious.**

Kalloch of San Francisco on the 10, in a speech, said that if the Judge decided that the Sheriff had no power to summon venire out of which a jury could be selected to try his son, I. M. Kalloch, the Judge would do so in defiance of all law, precedent and Christian courtesy, and that he (Kalloch) would never stand by the support of such a lawless and infamous proceeding, but would call upon the people to stand by him against the attempt. Speaking to the audience he said: "If you will not stand by me you may build my funeral pyre on the corners of your streets and place me upon it. The Republican machine politicians may light their torches and burn me up, and you must take the consequences. [Applause.] This is only a hypothetical statement of the case, and don't you forget what I tell you. I wish I could state things plainly, but I must state them hypothetically and trust to your good sense in drawing the right conclusion."
