Another Invention for Saving Gold.

Campbell, Jones & Kennedy, of the Union iron works, of Portland, had an- Board by the Day, Week or Month. other practical test of a quartz crushing invention of E. W. Jones, superintendent of the works. It is claimed toat this machine will save the fine gold and silver, which, by the old ordinary process of quartz crushing, would float away. By this process stamps are done away with entirely. The quartz is first passed into a quartz breaker, which reduces it to about the size of a pea; then it is passed into a revolving machine, known as the salmon pulverizer. This reduces it to a very fine pulp, which is washed out of this machine and passes refurnished throughout and is again open to the down a sluice to the amalgamator. Here the entire pulp is forced through same 400 pounds of quicksilver in a machine of this capacity, which is about six tons in 24 hours. The tailings show not the slightest sign of quicksilver. The principle of this amalgamator is to create a vacuum under the column of quicksilver, by means of a revolving cylinder, which admits the pulp under the column.
