Senator Squire to-day presented a memorial from the board of trustees of the Bellingham Bay Chamber of Commerce, asking for the improvement of Swinomiah channel, in the state of Washington.

The house committee on pensions to-day decided to report favorably Mr. Hermann's bill granting a pension to Rev. R. C. Martin, of Clackamas county, Or.

The resolution introduced by Senator Mitchell to-day, directing the committee on foreign relations to report as to the advisability of advancing the American legation at the empire of Turkey to the grade of a second-class mission, is intended for the benefit of Minister Hirsch, who was appointed from Oregon.

In the house to-day McComas introduced a bill, which was referred, to regulate the place, time and manner of holding elections for representatives in congress.

The differences of opinion as to whether the act which admitted the four states of Washington, Montana and the Dakotas repealed the homestead pre-emption law, has led to the introduction of a bill which will, if it becomes a law, put an end to all questions which might arise under different legal rulings.

Senator Mitchell to-day introduced a resolution calling upon the committee on finance, who are inquiring into the tariff, to investigate and if practicable prepare a provision for a duty on hops.
