And Promptly Proceed to Perform Their Duties

Our state lawmakers met in accordance with constitutional demands and immediately proceeded to business. Senator Theo. Cameron, held over from last session, took chair. J. N. Williamson, of Coos county, was made temporary president by a rising vote. Moorhead and Grant were chosen temporary clerks.

Charles W. Fulton, of Astoria, was chosen president of the senate. After the oath of office was administered by Justice Dean, he immediately proceeded with business and the same code of rules were adopted as that under which the business of the last legislative body acted.
