In the Prohibition National Convention of 1886 the platform included a women suffrage plank In the Prohibition National Convention of 1900 the indorsement of woman suffrage was omitted from the platform, but a resolution favoring it was adopted in the convention. The Ohio Prohibitionists have now formally disearded woman suffrage as a party principle. In Colorado, where woman suffrage exists, there are very tew Prohibitionists, and in Wyoming there were none at the last Presidential election.
