The goldsmiths of the time were among the first to create jewels possessing truly artistic features. Cellini was among those who owed their fame to the patronage of dignitaries of the church. Not only did he attain celebrity through the favor of a pope and numerous cardinals, but he also suffered in consequence of their petty jealousies and offended dignity, for which, however, it is but just to state that his own hasty temper was in no small degree responsible.
