OUR DEAD PRESIDENT

The death of President McKinley caused as great a shock as did the first news of the shot which laid him low. The hopeful reports from the physicians had caused the people to believe that all danger was past, and though few credited the prediction that he "would report for duty in two weeks," it seemed to be only a matter of time until he would be restored to health. Then, when the news of his sudden relapse came, followed so soon by his death, the revulsion of feeling was painful.

It is perhaps too soon to write calmly of the dead president. Amid the flood of unmeasured eulogy which is being poured



out, a coldly critical analysis of his character would convey an impression not intended. In fact, his very weaknesses have been, in some respects, a source of strength and have enabled him to sail smoothly and to steer the ship of state safely through situations which a man of different disposition could not have coped with so successfully. Some of President McKinley's acts for which he has been most severely criticized by able men of his own party have really merited the highest praise. He has been accused of "holding his ear to the ground" too assiduously; but, from the standpoint of the masses of the people whose executive he was, this was one of his greatest sources of strength. They can never be made to believe that his evident wish to fulfil the desires of a majority of the American people was at all reprehensible. He has been accused of being an opportunist in politics and statesmanship; yet an opportunist can sometimes accomplish results, when an unchanging advocate of fixed ideas would only beat his brains out against a stone wall.

Of William McKinley's private character and domestic life even his bitterest enemies have been able to utter no word of condemnation; and this is of itself an eulogy. The purity of his private life, his unflinching care and loving devotion to an invalid wife—these set an example which is worth much. In spite of the cynic, such things have an unmeasured influence for good.

William McKinley will go down in history as one of the great men of the nation; and his tragic death will indissolubly link his name with those of the two greater men who, before him, fell by the assassin's bullet while filling the presidential office.

Lithographic Stone.
A deposit of lithographic stone has been found near Mount Sterling, Ky., which Eugene Leary of the United States geological survey believes to be more valuable than any gold mine. "There is no reason," says Mr. Leary, "why the quarry should not control the market in this country. HOW TO DEAL WITH ANARCHISTS

The assassination of President McKinley has brought most forcibly to the front the question of what to do with the anarchists, and it is a poor sort of newspaper or prominent man that does not have an infallible solution ready. The press, however, seems to confine itself to lurid but vague talk about amending the immigration laws, excluding anarchists, preventing anarchists meeting and prohibiting the advocates of anarchy from uttering or printing their murderous tenets. All these makeshifts are radically and irremediably weak. Until we have infallible and impeccable official mind-readers, no immigration laws can exclude anarchists, without excluding all immigration. Prohibit anarchists from meeting in public and they will meet in private where they cannot be watched. Prohibit them from speaking and they will whisper. As a matter of fact the American people would not endure for a week, any system one-half so rigorous as those which on the continent of Europe, with all the power of despotic governments behind them, have no perceptible effect in stopping the growth of anarchistic sentiment. Prohibit a man from advocating his ideas, and every one will make it his business to find out what those ideas are. Imprison a man for talking and you make a martyr of him at once. Prevent any class of citizens from meeting freely, and you arouse antagonism in quarters where no sympathy with anarchy could be found.

The effective way to deal with anarchists in this country was pointed out years ago, in the case of the Chicago assassins, and no better course could now be adopted than to round up every known anarchist within reach of the law, and for every one who could be proved to have advocated violence provide a piece of hemp. Hang every mother's son and daughter of them who has spoken or written incitation to murder, and it will be many a long year before any will be found to work the feelings of the crowd up to the point where a president of the United States will be murdered in cold blood. This will only be cold justice. Emma Goldman, Herr Most and all the rest of them are as guilty as the wretch whose bullet laid the president low. Let them suffer the same fate as he, and such "leaders" will be careful where they lead.

A Penicillin Mixture.

The mantle used in the Weibach light is made of a combination or mixture of two rare earths known as thorium and ceria, and to produce the proper effect they must be combined in a definite proportion. If combined in equal quantities, they give practically no light, the mantle merely becoming red-hot. The effective combination is 50 per cent of thorium and 1 per cent of ceria. Why this very slight addition of ceria to the thorium should so enormously increase the light is not yet thoroughly understood. It has been found that a mantle made wholly of either earth will give only about one-eleventh as much light as one made of the proportions just named.
