MINIATURE LANDSCAPES.

How Hills, Valleys and Parks Are Reproduced in Paper Models.

"Building up the country" is an undertaking which may be approached in many ways, but perhaps few people know that the process can be literally applied to the work that is constantly being done in miniature by topographical engineers. The process, which is remarkable for its simplicity, is well illustrated by a series of models in the civil engineering department of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Boston, where the "building up" of certain sections of the country has been done every day.

A piece of country is selected, for example, which includes a pond, a valley and a range of hills. The engineer makes a map of the selected region and in charcoal, carbonite and antimony, Mr. and Mrs. Curtis have separated these metals by complex and costly processes that need not be described. Less than two grains of carbon result from every ton of mineral. The melting point of this metal is one million milliliters of a watt, and the displacement of the metal is one milligram in 1,000,000,000 years. When the dust of this metal is present in the laboratory, all the apparatus present is electrical, rendered radio active, in spite of ordinary insulation.

To make his profile model from these data the engineer starts with a sheet of cardbord the size of the map. This is supposed to represent the level of the water in the pond. Another piece of cardbord has a hole cut in it to represent the pond itself and is pasted to the first piece. A third piece of cardbord is cut to conform to the lines of the next level and pasted upon the second, and this process is repeated for each counter line until step by step the hills are built up. The result is a rough model of the whole region to be illustrated, the successive attitudes being shown by regular steps, each as high as the thickness of the cardbord. VILLAGE IMPROVEMENT.

What a Woman's Society Has Accomplished in a New York Town.

In a town in central New York the Ladies' Village Improvement society has purchased open claim for the village theater and a street sprinkler. Five of the women have been designated the "ladies' relief," and they make coffee and provide refreshments for the citizens at first. The society has exercised its influence against the prevalent habit of the male population of spitting tobacco juice on the sidewalks and has had a gratifying measure of success. It also brought about the enactment of a village ordinance which provides for the arrest of tramps if found within the limits of the village, and notices to this effect are posted along the highways near the town and on the trees in town.

The society fosters town pride and public spirit, and through its untiring efforts the village stands out as a model to be followed. Since its organization the society has completely changed the aspect of the town, and where neglect and carelessness were formerly the rule neatness and tidiness now prevail. Fences and sidewalks are kept in repair, lawns laid out, the streets cleared of rubbish, and flowers and shrubbery have taken the place of weeds. The women's influence has extended to the neighboring farmers, who, patterning after what they have seen in the village, shave their lawns and make their cottages and fences neater. The society, it should be added, religiously abstains from politics.
