**Feeding Little Chicks.**

It seems to matter little what kind of food we give as long as it is rich in the elements of growth and the chicks keep in the right condition—in fact, we ought to feed as much of a variety as possible. The best feeding mix, bred for chicks this season, contains the first few days and run combined with about one-eighth part animal meal mixed with a little cold water and lots of hard boiled eggs. I had several hundred fertile eggs, and they made fine food for chicks if one is careful not to feed enough to enstagnate them. With hens I have to omit the oatmeal, for, although it is the best food for chicks, it is too expensive food for even the chicks after 4 days old, and some poultry hens eat more than the chicks. I have generally fed bread soaked in water or milk when it could be had, mixed in chopped boiled eggs, animal and Indian meal at times, for the first few days and baked corn cakes crumbled fine.—H. Crank in Poultry Monthly.

**Perforated Bread Boxes.**

When bread is taken from the oven, it should be exposed to pure air until perfectly cool before being wrapped in a bread box. A bread box should always be perforated so the air can have access to the bread. When bread is shut in an airtight box, it becomes moist and grows moldy.
