

After Moving Grass, Proper treatment is very important after mowing grass. Some grass is eut too clearly, and then the hayrake is so set as to dig into the turf, disladging sets or stools that may not recover if a dry spell comes. If the horseralie teeth do not scratch the ground, it will not injure the sod. As to cutting or feeding the after-math, Colonel James Ward of New

York state says: Mowing is worse than grazing. However, it is possible to have too much of a good thing. There may be such a heavy aftergrowth that it is in the way. 
