

The remaining 30 miles of the flume furnish one of the most exciting rides which can be taken. Sometimes men take the ride for pleasure, but not often. Once a voman rode down. The flume men ride on rafts, light, dry, 16 foot planks piled wedge share, 20 inches wide at the top and six at the bottom and ten luches thick. Strangers usually ride on a box or boat, a triangular box built to fit the flume, open at the forward end, but solid aft. Against this the water pushes and forces the box along.

It was on a box that the Lawler party rode, and what astonished the flume men was that the weight of three beavy men, combined with the bumping and scraping of the box along the sides of the flume, to see nothing of the tons and tons of water piled up behind, did not cause the lightly constructed tresties to give way. Such a thing has imprened before. A fall,

especially on the grade, is sure death. Starting from the mill, the flume passes over great sawdust plies-piles as big in area as City Hall park in New York and 15 feet deep. So solidly is the sawdust piled that the trees have all been killed and turned black, as if a forest fire had once raged there, Then for five miles it runs along the side of the canyon close to the creek, through dense woods which form a continuous green arch above. At the end of this first section is a station, and here it is that the real ride begins. It is called the grade, and for another five miles you ride with your heart to your mouth. 

Short 4-foot Wa hemlock boards are put around outside to keep the earth from touching the plant. The floor of the sile is clay beaten solid, banked up a little against the sides to keep out the air and hollowed a little in the center. Two pieces of oak are put on each side of the sile, and the bottom and the fifth Iron hoops are put through them, drawn up tight and serew tapped at both ends with nuts and washers. Then put the first plank on the foundation, raise it up and hold it in place by wire nails bent round the hoops. Do not drive the nails through the plank. See that it is plumb, otherwise the sile will be crooked. Put up all the other planks in succession. carefully adjusting the edges. Tighten up the hoops already on and put on the others. The square edges of the planks will bind into one another. During the tightening up make the planks keep in their pinces with a wooden mallet. Put the hemlock planks around outside,


