## NEW CABLE FOR COOS RIVER PHONE

Manager Robertson and Linen by Ed Cole, of the Telephone Co., were engaged on a good rainy-day job yesterday. They were making a 500 foot submarine cable for the Coos river line to lead across the bay to the East Marshfield wharf.

The cable across here has consisted of an insulated copper wire, reinforced by being laid at intervals to a wire-rope and considerable trouble has been experienced with it. Now, however, Manager Robertson considers himself master of the situation, as he has a little old cable factory of his own and by the simple exercise of muscular exertion on the part of two men can turn out first-class submarine cable at the rate of 4000 yards daily and better a very long time.

The cable consists of a strand of Okonite-insulated copper wire, wrapped with eight strands of galvanized wire and presenting the appearance of an ordinary wire-rope about 1/2 inch in diameter.

The machine on which this is made—but we are sworn to secrecy on that point. We can say, however, that it is a wonder to behold and is manufactured at Libby and engineered by the Libby Manufacturing Company's short but pretty extensive works. Many people have missed the hinge from which we can tell him just when to quit it, and the next time they are in a "dog" item for the West, we can probably give him information of value. We don't notice Chamberlain's last eye-glasses, but they may be worked into the machine where they don't show up.

#### Only One Bid

A special meeting of the city council was held Monday evening for the purpose of opening bid for improvement of Front street, but as only one bid had been handed in the matter was postponed until Feb. 18th. It seems that there are several parties that desired to put in bids but there has been difficulty in getting an estimate of the cost of the lumber, as the mills are crowded with orders. The extension of time will probably result in several bids being made.

Mrs. Alfred Johns of Coquille came over on the train yesterday to visit her husband, who is employed in the railroad machine shops in this city.

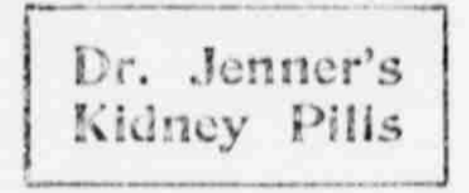
An appropriation of \$4500 has been made for the purpose of erecting a new light house at Cape Blanco.
