COUNCIL MEETING

Bids for Street Work Opened

VACCINATION ORDINANCE LAID ON THE TABLE

New Regulations Against Cesspools, Sewers, Etc.—Another Meeting Tonight

The city council met Tuesday evening for the purpose of opening the bids for the planking of north front street. Councilmen Norton, Eickworth, Bradbury, Nelson and Noble and City Attorney Farrin were present...

The bids opened were as follows:

- W. A. Neal, \$2,175. Hiram King, cedar caps and stringers, \$1,942.95. T. R. Spencer; all fir, \$1,799.76; cedar caps and stringers, \$1,874.76. D. G. Beal \$2,183.50. T. D. Holland; cedar blocks, caps, stringers and planking, \$2,256.49; fir plank, balance cedar, \$1,921.60. Christensen & Johnson; fir, \$2,235. John Blumquist; fir, \$1,885.

The choice lay between Spencer's bid for fir plank, cedar caps and stringers, and Holland's bid for all cedar, and a decision was postponed until the property owners interested could be consulted...

An ordinance requiring the vaccination of all children and teachers in attendance at the public school who have not had the smallpox or been vaccinated, was after some discussion laid on the table.

A liquor license was granted to T. F. Crawford.

The following bills were ordered paid: D. L. Rood, repairing bridge, \$22.15; F. E. Nelson, work on fire engine, \$2.95; John Bear, 1 ton coal, \$3.50.

The adjoining property owners were ordered to build a new cross walk half way across 3rd street on A.

An ordinance was passed to provide for the prevention and removal of nuisances, and to declare what shall constitute a nuisance.

The ordinance is quite stringent in its provisions, and forbids any unwholesome or refuse animal or vegetable matter, being deposited within the corporate limits. Even impure water must not be allowed to remain anywhere in town...
