### DIED

STRANG—In—Marshfield, Oregon, March 14, 1902, Emily M. [unclear] of D. P. Strang Sr., aged 59 years, 5 months and 28 days.

Deceased was born in Rutland Vt., in 1842. Her family later removed to Minnesota, and in Rice county, that state, she was married to D. P. Strang June 20, 1858. In 1871 they came to Oregon, reaching Coquille between Christmas and New Year. In 1873 they moved to Marshfield, where they resided about 5 years when they returned to the Coquille where they have resided ever since.

Deceased had been a member of the Seventh Day Advent church about 22 years and highly esteemed by all who knew her.

Mrs. Strang's health has never been good on this coast, and of late years she has failed quite rapidly, until her ailments terminated in dry gangrene, which attacked her foot. She was brought to Marshfield for medical treatment, but this was unavailable. Of six children born to Mr. and Mrs. Strang three survive: David P. Jr. and Zenas C., of Coquille, and Frank E. of Eastern Oregon. On account of the disease which caused her death, immediate burial was necessary, and the funeral was in this city, Saturday afternoon, Rev. R. C. Lee, officiating.

It is evident that Portland dealers are awaking to the fact that the Coos Bay trade would be worth coming after. Mr. Gray recognizes the fact, however, that so long as San Francisco furnishes the best market for our products, Portland is handicapped in her efforts to divert buyers to her markets. While he finds a very friendly spirit among the merchants here, he could not mention names.

### For New Steamer Line

Messrs. Addis and Wilson, of the Oregon Coast Navigation Company, recently organized a Portland, came down on the Atlantic a couple of weeks ago, looking over the ground and interviewing the men here in the interests of their agents.

It is proposed to build a steamer to run between Coos Bay and Portland, calling at Astoria, Tillamook. A steamer of about 400 tons is wanted and Messrs. Addis and Wilson have been in consultation with Capt. H. Reed and have asked him for estimates on such a boat.

Very likely a trade might be worked up in these small way-ports that would pay running expenses for an inexpensive boat.

If the project is carried out, it is to be hoped that the steamer will be built here.
