Another Peace Rumor

BOERS GRANTED PASSES THROUGH BRITISH LINES

To Confer With Each Other About Possible Proposals to End War

London, Mar. 24.—The official explanation was given today of the reported coming visit, for conference on terms of peace, of Acting President of the Transvaal Schalkburger and other Boer leaders.

The reason for giving safe conduct of the prominent Boer through the British lines Saturday was announced in the House of Commons when parliamentary Secretary of war Broderick, in answer to a question, said that about a fortnight ago Schalkburger indicated to General Kitchener a desire for safe conduct through the British lines. Schalkburger wished to see ex-President Steyn of the Orange Free state with reference to possible peace proposals.

Washington, Mar. 24.—Among the members of the house, Republicans as well as Democrats, it is quite freely expected that exposures in prospect will shake the treasury department to the foundation. The immigration bureau is not the only one involved, but scandals are hinted at which are said to exist in bureaus of which Assistant Secretary Taylor had charge.

An official who has had charge of certain contracting on a yearly salary of \$1,000, is building a \$5,000 house.

It is also stated that Commissioner of Immigration Powers was aware of the scandals on Ellis Island, and insisted on an investigation, which took place.

It is declared, however, that Taylor suppressed the facts and prevented the removal of the guilty person.

NOVEL PROCEEDINGS IN FEDERAL COURT

Brings a New Element into the Railroad Complications

Chicago, Mar. 24.—With the consent of defendants, Federal Judge Groscup today issued the temporary injunction ordered by the interstate commerce commission to restrain the Illinois Central, Michigan Central, Lake Shore, Pennsylvania, Fort Wayne & Chicago & Northwestern railroads from cutting rates. The order will remain in effect until June 9th.

The court when entering the order warned the representatives of the defendants company that he would probe to the extreme limit and severely punish any violation of the injunction.

The proceeding is a most novel one. According to railroad lawyers Judge Groscup's action, if the bill finally lit, will mean a vital part of the interstate commerce act, and that the federal courts, in the maintenance of freight rates, will be absolute masters of the railway companies.

The delegates, who will be elected, are to come here with Mr. Moseley at his expense. They will be accompanied by newspaper and literary men, and will visit America in order to see and learn. Mr. Moseley will also defray the expenses of a visit to the United States at the same time of a commission, whose object will be to inquire into the educational systems of this country.
