SMALL BOAT CAPSIZED
Charles Sandin and Miss Minnie Holmstrom Are Rescued From the Bay

Chas. Sandin and Miss Minnie Holmstrom had a very narrow escape from drowning Saturday afternoon opposite this city. They had started from Marshfield in a small boat bound for Kentuck slough and when opposite the A street wharf a gust of wind caught the sail and the boat was overturned.

Mr. Sandin managed to climb onto the overturned boat. Miss Holmstrom became entangled in the sheet line in such a manner as to make it impossible for her to get out of the water without assistance. Their cries attracted quite a large crowd to the docks, and numerous small boats put out to their rescue. They were rescued from their perilous situation by E. W. Smith and Joe Vineyard, after being in the water for nearly a quarter of an hour. They were apparently none the worse for the accident and were so little disturbed by the mishap that they wanted to bail out the boat and continue their journey, but they were persuaded to come up town again for dry clothes.
