(She was sick in bed at that time.) In a few minutes the chancellor returned and, returning the sheet of paper to the diplomat from Wurtemberg, he added, "I hope that I did not spoil it by writing something on it."
Here follows what was written on the paper:
My long life has taught me that it is necessary to forgive a good deal and forget nothing.

A little forgetfulness does not diminish the sincerity of forgiveness.
T. THIERS.
My own life has taught me that I have a great deal to forget and a great deal to be forgiven.
