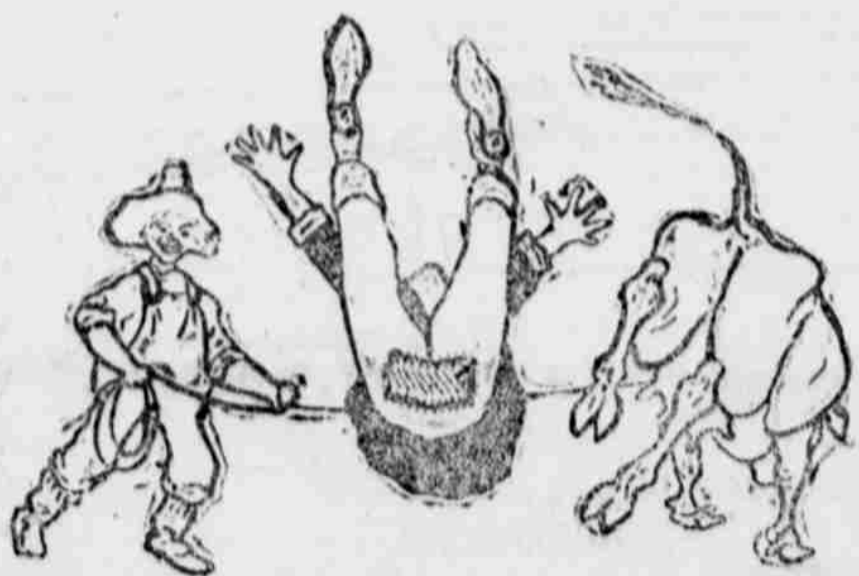
Farewell Party

ANOTHER WILDCAT

PROPOSITION

Portland Wants to Know How Much we Will Give For a Railroad.

Mayor Coke has received a communication from the Portland Chamber of Commerce, asking what the people of Coos Bay would do in way of subsidy for a railroad from Portland to Coos Bay.

Here is another illustration of the attitude which Portland assumes toward this section and which will have to be materially changed before very close business relations can be established. Portland seems to hug the delusion that the people of this section are or ought to be very anxious to be allowed to deal with that city instead of San Francisco. She comes at us with such propositions as the above, or sends men down here to take subscriptions for stock to build a steamer for the trade, which is simply asking for a donation to induce Portland parties to give us the favor of their attention.

The fact is that Coos Bay is asking nothing of Portland. Portland has never done anything for us except to oppose appropriations for our harbor. She offers us nothing now except an occasional chance to pay for the privilege of patronizing her.

If Portland wants anything of Coos Bay let her come off from her high horse and say so. Portland wants Coos Bay trade. Let her say so and offer some inducement, instead of intimating that she would condescend to take our money if it were offered in a sufficiently humble spirit.

Such a proposition as the one first mentioned above is simply wild. The parties who made the inquiry evidently had no serious thought of a railroad, and before they exerted themselves to even think seriously of it, they propound the question: "How much will you give for the privilege of being connected with Portland by rail?"

We advise Portland to change her attitude if she wants anything of Coos Bay.

As the story is told, Mr. Jumper was going to Coos City and had with him a double barreled hammerless shotgun. He stopped to speak to Mrs. Oldland. He stood tapping the butt of the gun on the ground, and in some manner the jet caused the discharge of the piece. The entire charge struck him in the head, killing him instantly.

The unfortunate man was a native of Kansas, and had been in this section some five or six years, having worked at Libby for about three years past.

He was about 55 years of age, and leaves a wife and six children.
