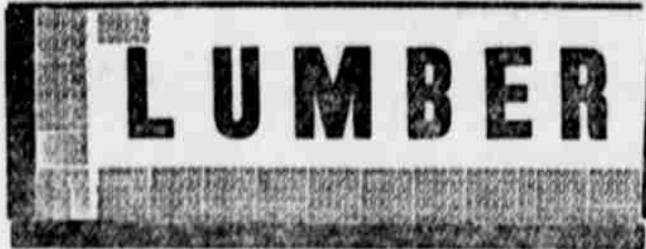


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Verdict for Bridges

The case of Jas. H. Hibbard vs A. Bridges, was tried before Justice Hyde Thursday afternoon, before a jury consisting of Is. Lando, John Snyder, E. W. Lewis, S. C. Brown and E. A. Eickworth. The verdict was for defendant.

This was a suit brought to recover possession of a horse, belonging to the plaintiff, which was levied upon by defendant acting as special deputy for Sheriff Gallier, in a suit in which A. M. Evans was plaintiff and J. H. Hibbard was defendant. Hibbard claimed the horse as exempt from execution, as it was one of his team with which he makes a living. The point made by defendant's counsel, A. E. Seaman was that as Bridges had acted as the deputy of the sheriff, the suit should have been brought against the sheriff. This was the view taken by the jury. The matter will probably come up again.
