The preliminary examination of Wm. Gall, charged with assault with a dangerous weapon alleged to have been committed upon the person of J. L. Ferry, Jr., took place before Justice Hyde Monday afternoon.

A great deal of interest was taken in this case and the little city court room was crowded with spectators, including a number of friends of the accused, from Libby. The state's case was handled by Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Ed Farrin, while W. U. Douglas acted as attorney for the accused.

The undisputed facts were as given in the MAIL last week.

The case was taken under advisement by his Honor until 11 a m today.

After sleeping over the case, Justice Hyde rendered his decision in the Gall case Tuesday, releasing the accused from study.
